a) A quorum was met. Steve Krautscheid moved a motion to approve the EDC Minutes for March 10, 2022. Tom Raabe seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

5. DISCUSSION/DECISION ITEMS:

- a) Revisiting the Economic Development Strategic Plan & Discussing Current Economic Development Trends/Challenges – John Southgate, Southgate Consulting: John helped develop the original EDC Strategic Plan. He states that when people are looking at a new community the top two factors they consider are; schools and grocery stores. His rule of government is “Set the table and get out of the way” and “Never try to outsmart the public sector.” Brenna posed the question “Which goals are short term critical?” In an open discussion the key takeaways were: Main Street appeal/attraction, Oak Street Project, Shovel ready Industrial land. Other key factors included: promote energy into local businesses, tourism, affordable housing and workforce development.

Consider using/developing sub-committees to help with this process.

6. B/C COMMUNICATIONS:

Juanita Lint of The Chamber of Commerce presented a slide show presentation of the video WE ARE FOREST GROVE. The video was done by Vandelay Productions, a local company. The video can be found on YouTube, The Chambers website, The City's website and Juanita plans to run some paid social media campaigns. The video won an award at the Oregon State Chamber of Commerce gathering. The Chamber currently has no support staff. There are 2 positions available; An Administrative Assistant and a Tourism Coordinator.

7. STAFF COMMUNICATIONS:

a) Project Meriwether:

A sustainable data center by Rowan Digital. With this project, Forest Grove has an opportunity to emerge as a leader within the Silicon Forest. This project will bring 105 direct jobs and 7,700 indirect construction jobs. The current zoning of this property, together with the close proximity to the highway, necessary utilities, and the potential to help the city expand nearby, makes this site perfect for a green data center. Tentative date for a virtual meeting with Rowan Digital is set for May 4th at 6-7pm.

b) Small Business Grants:

\$107k was dispersed to 26 Local Businesses. Grants ranged from \$2500-\$7500, based on numbers of employees. Businesses had to show a loss of revenue or an increase in operating costs to qualify.

c) Washington County Consortium for CDBG Microenterprise Program:

Forest Grove has joined the CDBG (Community Development Block Grant) along with Washington County, King City, Tigard and Cornelius. Each City/County will receive 100k.

8. COUNCIL LIAISON REPORT:

a) Council Liaison – Councilor Tim Rippe:

The engineering building has been demolished in preparation for the new DSA Building (Development Services Annex) This will house our Engineering and Building Department and will streamline our permitting and front counter services. The old City Hall building will be getting a remodel. The Quarterly Town meeting will be May 4th at 6:30pm. The Public Arts Commission approved 2 murals located by Pizza Schmizza and Bard Park. They appointed artist Allison McClay. Park and Recreation revised their fee schedule, discussed disbursement of scholarship funds, and what new services can be offered if the levy passes. House Bill 2001 will need to be in place by June 30th. The Forestry Commission participated in Tree City USA Arbor Day, and planted trees in memory of Ron Thompson and Tom Johnson.
